**EACH LINE REPRESENTS ONE CLASS OR BLOCK**. THERE ARE <u>8 BLOCKS</u> AVAILABLE PER ACADEMIC YEAR. Selection of your courses depends on your post-secondary plans and your career/college plans. Talk to your counselor about your plans after high school and what courses will best help you reach your goals!

Students in Fine Arts Courses beginning in 2012-2013 are eligible to place in one of four levels:

Beginning | Intermediate | Proficient | Advanced

Students who place into the **Proficient** Level or the **Advanced** Level will be eligible to receive *Honors Credit* (4.5 Weight) for each semester of their participation at this level. Criteria to receive Honors Credit at the Proficient or Advanced Level are based upon the *Essential Standards* Course of Study.
