<b>Tenth Grade</b>	
1 - English 2 (Honors) 2 - Math 2 or Math 3 3 - Chemistry (Honors) or Biology (Honors) if not taken in 9 <sup>th</sup> Grade 4 - Civics (Honors) 5 - World Language (Spanish 1) or Math 3 *As an additional Math 6 - Career Technical Education, JROTC, Fine Arts, or Social Studies <b>Elective**</b> 7 - Beginning, Intermediate, or Proficient (Honors) (Fall) 8 - Beginning, Intermediate, or Proficient (Honors) (Spring)	> Career and Technical Electives are not <u>required</u> for graduation or college admission but are great preparation for college and career choices. > **Psychology and Sociology are available to Tenth Grade students as elective courses.
<b>Eleventh Grade</b>	
1 - English 3 (Honors) or AP English 3 2 - Math 3 or Discrete Math or Pre-Calculus (Honors), or Intro to Statistics/AP Statistics 3 - Physical Science, Chemistry (Honors), Physics (Honors) or Physics Honors/AP Physics 4 - Intro to American Studies (Honors) <b>AND</b> AP US History or American History 1 (Honors) 5 - Honors or AP Schedule Space (for TWO BLOCK courses) 6 - World Language (Spanish 2) 7 - Beginning, Intermediate, or Proficient (Honors) (Fall) 8 - Beginning, Intermediate, or Proficient (Honors) (Spring)† The eleventh grade has more AP choices/options but these are not requirements. Many students will utilize the Honors/AP choice with Math, Social Studies, or Science courses in twelfth grade as well.	> AP English 3 is only ONE block, not two. > Any <i>ITALICIZED</i> combination of Honors/AP classes such as requires <b>TWO BLOCKS</b> . An example is AP US History and Introduction to American Studies Honors > Must have taken Common Core Math 3 for any Advanced Math and for Physics Honors > † <b>Visual Art does have AP course choices.</b> Students recommended for AP Visual Art courses should talk with their instructor for placement options.

1 - English 4 (Honors) or AP English 4 2 - Math 4, or Discrete Math, or Pre-Calculus (Honors), or Intro to Statistics/AP Statistics, Intro to Calculus/AP Calculus 3 - Science <b>Elective</b> (Physics Honors/AP Physics, Anatomy and Physiology, Intro to Biology/AP Biology, Chemistry 2 Honors/AP Chemistry, AP Environmental Science) 4 - Economics and Personal Finance 5 - World Language (Spanish 3) or Honors/AP Elective Schedule Space 6 - Career-Technical <b>Elective</b> OR Social Studies <b>Elective</b> (Psychology, Sociology, AP Psychology, AP European History, AP Government, AP Human Geography) 7 - Beginning, Intermediate, or Proficient (Honors) (Fall) 8 - Beginning, Intermediate, or Proficient (Honors) (Spring)†	> Some college bound seniors may choose to take three levels of Spanish > Being a NC Scholar requires four electives in one subject area. Students in Fine Arts Courses beginning in 2012-2013 are eligible to place in one of four levels:  
 Beginning | Intermediate | Proficient | Advanced

Students who place into the **Proficient** Level or the **Advanced** Level will be eligible to receive *Honors Credit* (4.5 Weight) for each semester of their participation at this level. Criteria to receive Honors Credit at the Proficient or Advanced Level are based upon the *Essential Standards* Course of Study.
